Per order of Chairman Fisk, the meeting was called to order at 6:30 P.M.

1. Pledge of Allegiance**2. Introductions and Seating of Alternate Commissioners**

Chairman Fisk designated regular Commissioners Robinson, Carros, Massaro, Duquette, Richie, Rooks and Fisk as voting members tonight.

3. Public Participation

Lucy Cushman, 189 Redstone Hill Road, Chimney Crest Condominium Association, spoke for the condo association regarding the retention pond they have on their property. This retention pond is located in a designated wetlands watercourse. New construction at 50 Field Rock has been adding an excessive amount of fill on their property which is washing into and causing damage to the pond. The pond was recently dredged and restored to wetland standards. The continuing silt runoff is preventing this balance to be maintained as well as the maintenance work to be done. They are asking the city of help in getting a cease and assist to try to resolve the issues it is causing.

Randy Lindstrom, 261 Mark St, spoke regarding flooding and water issue he is having due to a neighbor that has an active permit to add fill to create a horseshoe pit on his property. He stated that there has been an extra amount of fill added over the permit approved and it has caused tremendous flooding and water on his property. He spoke to Nancy Levesque's at the city and sent photos and videos of the water that is occurring on his property.

Nancy Levesque, city engineer, stated she does have all the photos and videos as well, but had no chance to add to the agenda. She has spoken to the enforcement officer regarding having the applicant come to the next meeting.

Dan Strahowski, 253 Mark St, spoke to the same issue that 261 Mark St is having. We have a very high-water table that we all struggle with. We all have sump pumps and it's a constant issue with the water. I have 2 sumps and the whole side of my foundation has been channeled out with pipes. I have 3 outside drains next to the hatchway. I did leave a message for the neighbor to contact me about the water diversion, but I never heard back from him, so I called the town. I have sent photos and videos to show how deep he has dug and the addition of corrugated drain pipes he added, which are aimed at my yard. The video shows how it flows like a river now. It has never been like this before., I have had to put surface water pumps in my yard to avoid it from going to my hatchway stairs. I have never had to do this and I have lived there 32 years. I understand it is a 5-year permit, and I would like the permit stopped and have the city rectify the issue for us.

Carol Kallberg, 29 Richard Ct., spoke to the board regarding why her property she has lived in for over 20 years, and is now being told she has to get flood insurance. She doesn't know why as she states that her property has never had a water or flooding issues since she has lived.

Nancy Levesque, City Engineer, gave the resident her business card and explained that FEMA has been upgrading their flood mapping, and told the resident to contact her for more information.

William Stango, Civil Engineer City of Bristol, reviewed the application regarding how the existing piping of the existing channel at 120 Perkins Street will be corrected. The removal of the existing flared end section, the installation of five manholes, pipe the channel approximately 200 feet down along the side of the property and restore the area with seed and planting. Due to the impact of the existing watercourse, we will be filling the area with 1100 sq. feet of fill and within the upland review area will be impacting 2700 sq. feet.

The commission asked if there was any consideration for other options for corrections using a lined channel or having looked up the hill for other options? If debris is caught in there what is the maintenance involved.?

William Stango, Civil Engineer, responded stating due to the sloping issue this was not an option due to the velocity and trying to reduce the erosion of occurring. The calculations for the amount of water during the design storm that the system will see, is roughly 36 cubic feet per second and by extending the 36-inch RCP will be delivering approximately 47 cubic feet per second of capacity so we are not expecting any backing up of the existing system. The maintenance is a standard procedure. We do have an existing catch basin at the street and five manhole structures along the line from 120 Perkins Street to the bottom. This would be standard procedure, put a camera down the lines, jet the lines from top to bottom or send a truck out there and back out the sediment and clear out the debris.

The commission asked if there is a scheduled maintenance plan.

William Stango, stated, we can incorporate that into our maintenance schedule. The city will be taking an easement for the structures and they will be city infrastructure and can be incorporated into regular maintenance.

Bruce Porrini, 135 Perkins St, stated he likes the plan submitted. He lives on the inlet of the culvert and has noticed the walls are being wiped out that he put on his property. The three ponds generate water and mud that come down and clog the culvert. He stated that at Hill St and Pinehurst there is a pond with a dock and he said they have been clearing out the land around it which is causing issues as well.

Nancy Levesque, City engineer, stated they are looking Hill and Pinehurst and they are looking at a lot of the basins to see if they are functioning as they are meant to. Public Works may contact the residents as well with a request for a possible easement and maybe to prevent some of the boulders we can look at a possible trash rack of some sort to help prevent some of the larger ones from coming down and through. They are checking all the basins to see if they are functioning like they should be and cleaning and maintenance will be done to keep them clear.

10. New Business

a. Chimney Crest

Nancy Levesque, City Engineer, stated that complaints were made and investigated. We had the owner bulk up the silt fence. The enforcement officer is out there on a regular basis and she also goes out regularly. They have recently cleaned out the pond and this does cost a large amount of money and we understand the concern. We are doing what we can to address it without actually shutting them down, which we are not recommending at this time. Monitoring is being done twice a week to make sure debris is not getting off the property.

b. Sherman Street

Nancy Levesque, City Engineer, stated she has received photos and videos. Engineering will be meeting with the property owners regarding the active permit. The applicant described it as a horseshoe pit but it looks like a Bocci court and it was installed at the low point of the yard and may have modified some of the drainage. Also, the pipes that were mentioned were supposed to be capped in accordance with the plans, but don't know if the cap disappeared at some point. This was a staff approved application.

The commission asked if he brought in over the staff approved, what is the recourse?

Nancy Levesque, stated that the recourse would be a cease and correct and get the material removed if it is over. Because the application is active and open, Engineering will put together a package and get it to the commission for review. This may mean having the property owner come in as well as potentially having the commission go out there and take a look at what happened. We could schedule a site walk the same night as Vera Road and Brace Avenue.
