- I. Call to Order
The meeting was called to order by Chairman Schmelder at 4:30pm.
The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.
- II. Approval of minutes of the Special Meeting of February 29, 2024
Chairman Schmelder called for a motion to approve the minutes of the Special Meeting of February 29, 2024. Commissioner Hick made the motion to approve the minutes which was seconded by Mayor Caggiano. All were in favor and the minutes were accepted into record.
- III. HUD recently announced allocations for 2024-25 (Program Year 50). The Committee's preliminary allocations anticipated flat-funding for 2025-26, but the entitlement was reduced by \$22,997. It is necessary to revise the allocations accordingly and make recommendations for funding to the ECD Board for approval.
 - a. Public Service applications
Chairman Schmelder started the discussion by noting that most of the draft allocations were the same as PY 49 or slightly lower. The panel discussed reducing all grants by the same amount, which would equal a reduction of \$345 for every grant. However, one proposed grant was higher than previous years with no special reason for the increase, and it was agreed to adjust that award to be in line with all others.
 - b. Public Facilities applications
Chairman Schmelder suggested that the Policy Committee not fund any Public Facility project for PY 50 allocation, in order to maintain the level of funding for the Residential Rehab Program.

Chairman Schmelder called for the motion to be read. Commissioner Hick made and read the motion as follows, seconded by Mayor Caggiano:

Motion to the recommendations for grant awards as listed, to the ECD Board for approval as follows:

- Boys and Girls Club - Cambridge Park Outreach - \$16,000
- St. Vincent DePaul Homeless Shelter - \$17,000
- United Way of West Central CT – Walsh Summer Work - \$3,000
- YWCA – Sexual Assault Crisis Services - \$4,000
- Prudence Crandall – Emergency Shelter - \$8,500
- Shepard Meadows - \$5,000
- Human Resources Agency - \$9,000
- Salvation Army Bristol Corps - \$11,000
- Grace Community Food Pantry - \$4,281
- BristolWorks! - \$4,000
- Fair Housing - \$3,000

The above grants total \$84,781.00 for Public Service.

The Policy Committee did not recommend support for any Public Facilities projects this year, due to the cuts in funding.

The city's Residential Rehabilitation Program will be funded \$250,812; \$240,000 for single family and \$10,812 for multi-family.

All were in favor of the motion to accept the CDBG allocation recommendations with no changes and the motion was approved.

IV. Motion to adjourn.

Chairman Schmelder requested a motion to adjourn. Commissioner Hick made the motion which was seconded by Mayor Caggiano. All were in favor and the meeting adjourned at 4:45pm.
