David Oaks and I walked the property and made a list of maintenance projects that need to addressed in the next fiscal year. He will be coming up with a plan to put those projects in motion.

Miscellaneous

The transition of new personnel to Engine 2 has gone extremely smooth. It will be a privilege to continue training new firefighters and officers assigned here.

Firefighters are completing equipment and inventory checks on-line. Officers are getting familiar with the new National Fire Incident Reporting (NFIR) format in First Due as well as updating pre-plan information in First Due.

Personnel

Station 4 welcomes new Lieutenants Derek Freimuth to C shift and Brian Plourde to D shift. Firefighter Justin Miller has returned to B shift from an extended injury. Recruit Firefighters Karl Quist, Stephanie Barry and Pablo Gomez-Charry have worked several shifts at Station 4 on A, C, and D shift respectively. New Firefighter Ben Mike has also worked at Station 4 on D shift.

Apparatus/ Equipment

Engine 4 remains in service but is scheduled to have the body damage repaired starting Monday August 29. Engine 6 remains in service as a spare.

Fire Station/ facilities

David Oakes from Public Works conducted a tour of Station 4 and grounds on July 21st to compile a list of Items that are in need of repair. A representative from Airus Fans made measurements of Station 4 bay for installation of fans to keep the warm air at floor level during the winter months.

Miscellaneous

Station 4 personnel conducted a facility tour of **ESPN** that was led by **ESPN** Safety Team Member Ed Connors. This is the first tour since before the COVID 19 pandemic began. This was a good refresher of the facility for those members that have been there before and very beneficial for the new members of the department. Engine 4 personnel also trained with the new and old confined space equipment at the drill-field with Training Officer James Blaschke.

APPARATUS/EQUIPMENT

Engine 5 is still having issues with the A/C system. There seems to be a problem with the cab mounts also. Loud and hard clunking from the cab while leaving the station. Equipment Technician has been notified. Engine 7 and Support 1 are both in good operating condition with all equipment being operational.

FIRE STATIONS/FACILITIES

A scheduled station walk through with Dave Oakes was completed and a list of items was compiled that need to be addressed. Some of these items were a bad faucet on the small kitchen sink, a broken P trap on the large kitchen sink, circulator #2 in the boiler room, HVAC Maint. , ceiling vent fan on apparatus floor and several other items that Dave Oakes is aware of and continues to address.

MISCELLANEOUS

Beginning in August Engine 5 will be getting started with Pre Plan surveys a bit more aggressively. Weather permitting. Data will be getting loaded into First Due. All four shifts will be assigned to an equal amount of Commercial Occupancies, Schools, and Senior Housing.

INCIDENTS

There were one hundred seventy two (172) incidents for the month of July 2022 that required computer-generated reports communicated to the State Fire Marshal's Office and FEMA. There was one (1) investigation(s) of fire/explosions by this office. Total estimated loss for the period is \$175,200 dollars.

403 West Street.

There was zero (0) civilian injurie(s), and seventeen (17) Firefighter injuries reported during this period. There were one (1) mutual aid call given/received within the month. A copy of the cumulative monthly inspection reviews and permits account is included with this report.

REVIEWS, MEETINGS, MISC.

- With the decrease in the number of positive Covid-19 cases, the interior of this office will remain closed to the public while all business will continue to be conducted electronically, or outside of the building while social distancing. It is paramount that we continue to safeguard the health and safety of the employees of this office.
- Twenty seven (27) plans for new construction, occupancy changes, and renovations were reviewed. Some of the plans included electrical and mechanicals, including Fire Alarm and Fire Sprinkler systems. Site plan drawings are also included. Coordination and consultation regarding plan review is ongoing with other city agencies.
- The Fire Marshal's Office attended four (4) formal Site Plan Committee meetings in July to coordinate details for future Plan Review submittals in the City of Bristol. Thirty four (34) other site meetings attended by staff were conducted with business/property owners.

- There were approximately one hundred twenty six (126) Fire Prevention Bureau business related calls managed by the staff.
- Approximately four (4) visitors were received at Fire Headquarters to speak with Fire Marshal's Office Personnel. All conversations and transactions were conducted outside of fire headquarters or within the hallway.
- The First Due Software went on-line at the beginning of the month. Acclimation to the new software is not without its challenges and we ask for patience until we have learned to navigate our way through its many reports.
- Fire Inspector Wes Hoyt successfully completed the Fire Code Inspector Class this month and achieved a passing score on his final exam. Inspector Hoyt is a welcomed addition to this office and has taken to his new role with renewed enthusiasm.

****** In larger residential occupancies, where the building construction is modular in design and contains similar apartments with like layouts and amenities, representative apartments are chosen at random to determine compliance with the Connecticut State Fire Safety Code (CSFSC) and the Connecticut State Fire Prevention Code (CSFPC). With smaller occupancies, we do commonly enter as many units as possible where access is granted and time permits. The corresponding figures represent the number of occupancies and the total number of units affected by the inspection. In order to remain compliant with the current inspection requirements, I strongly recommend increasing the number certified personnel in this office to eight (8). There has been a significant increase in the number of residential units alone within this city to support the need for additional personnel within this office.

MONTHLY TRAINING REPORT

July 2022

Training for July focused on Confined Space rescue refresher training. Confined space rescue training covers equipment and rescue techniques for performing vertical and horizontal confined space rescues. Some of the equipment covered is usage of meters for atmospheric monitoring, air supply systems / escape packs, rescue rope rigging and knots, haul systems and tripod usage, radio communications and patient packaging using various devices the department has (sked, stokes and LSP halfback). This class starts with a classroom presentation on confined space rescue, department capabilities, confined space permit system and components of confined space rescue. Skill stations are then performed by all personnel on belay systems and MPD device usage, Tripod rigging along with 4:1 haul system installation, donning and doffing class III rescue harness (Rock n Rescue and Petzl), chain of command for communications to operation officer and incident commander, patients packaged in Sked, Stokes and LSP halfback, supplied air system and regulator along with ventilation equipment. These individual skills stations are then put into operation for an upcoming simulated vertical confined space rescue in the live burn facility. A simulated downed worker is placed in a vault which is accessed by a 3 story vertical access.

Lockout / tag out training was also conducted this month as part of the confined space training. This class covers lockout / tag out capabilities of the department, methods to isolate or shutdown sources of electrical, hydraulic, pneumatic, chemical, thermal, gravitational and mechanical hazards that could be present in a confined space incident along with various other incidents. Methods to secure these sources, energy release if applicable and termination procedure for locked out sources.

Dementia awareness training was conducted for the personnel of BFD by dementia advocate and instructor, Lynn Litwinezyk. This class covered department interaction with patients with dementia symptoms during routine and emergency interactions. Strategies for successful interactions and potential behavior issue with patients were discussed.

ESPN campus tours were conducted this month to reflect the changes to both the North and Main campuses of ESPN. Edward Connors provided updated campus access maps, overview of new detection systems on campus, completed renovations of Buildings 1, 2 and 3 on Main campus along with many additional items that ESPN has implemented. This campus overview tour was very well received due to the large number of new officers and firefighters within the BFD.

Plainville Fire department contracted out the live fire training facility during July to do annual live fire training evolutions. PFD was able to have 8 live burn evolutions which

enabled them to put together the previous months of training leading up to the live burns. I responded to 5 incidents as safety officer during the Month of July.
